Trail Etiquette

- Always pass on the left when possible
- Do not litter
- Leave the trails cleaner than when you arrived
- Respect the privacy of those living along the trails
- No motorized vehicles
- Dogs must be leashed. Please clean up after your dog
- In areas where the trail crosses a roadway, all trail traffic must yield to the vehicular traffic.
- When travelling along the roadway, pedestrians are required to use the municipal sidewalk or travel on the shoulder of the road facing on coming traffic.
- Under no circumstances should anyone traverse the Canadian National Railway mainline


