8. New Business

8.1 Slow Roll proposal

J. Swart presented details of the slow roll proposal for Pelham. Will meet with V. vanRavenswaay next week to seek formal support from TOP with a specific request for washroom access, promotion, insurance coverage, and small budget for expenses such as water.

Support offered from group in Port Colborne that is also working on slow rolls. Will leave this as a networking opportunity rather than a formal partnership.

8.2 MTO Annual Road Safety Challenge 2017

Members reviewed draft proposal with ideas for safety challenge. Will continue with "Be Seen in Pelham" message. B. Clark will submit the application by the March 3rd deadline.

8.3 Bike to Work Week / Bike Month

Members discussed ideas with V. vanRavenswaay.

- June is Bike Month and Parks Month
- Town has a passport for Parks Month which could incorporate cycling message. Could feature new water stations in passport. Bike racks on transit could also be noted.
- Can promote Bike Month activities and proposed Slow Rolls during home show in April and at Farmer's Market
- Slow roll planned for second Tuesday in June
- MTO Road Safety Challenge takes place May 15 to June 11. Ads could refer to bike month activities
- Could align with opening of rail trail in Fenwick, which is being planned and dependent upon completion.

Decision:

- Will focus on a more generic bike month rather than just bike to work and encourage a message for people to try cycling to many local destinations.
- J. Swart and B. Clark will review plan with V. vanRavenswaay during meeting regarding slow roll activities.

8.4 Opening of rail trail

Opening date to be scheduled. Addressing signage, vandalism and some repairs to be completed.

PATC would like to see the 2017 Community Walk take place at the new Fenwick rail trail.

Need to consider name for trail. The committee discussed the evolution of the trail and its development.

Crossley and then transport by bus to start and finish location. Would require road closure.

Concerns that the attention of the race may get lost during the Summerfest activities and the logistics may strain resources.

The Town has agreed to cover the cost of two members of PATC to attend AT workshops. B. Clark has registered.
