

Pelham Council accepts challenge to bowl for kids

Big Brothers Big Sisters of South Niagara Executive Director Barb Van Der Heyden stood in front of Pelham Town Council and laid out a challenge: help make a difference in the lives of youth in your community.

As part of the BBBS annual fundraising effort, the Bowl for Kids Sake event brings communities together in a fun and inclusive way, raising the funds required to keep programming operational.

With over 105 years of service, BBBS provides programs free of charge, needing \$307,500 in fundraising to reach the annual budget.

“I am here tonight to ask for assistance from Town Council and residents of Pelham,” said Van Der Heyden. “All funds from this event will stay in the southern communities.”

The goal of the event is to match 30 littles from the current wait list. To do this, \$30,000 needs to be raised.

This year’s theme is zombies, and the Town’s will be sending the “Killer Council” team on March 3, at 4:30 p.m. at Bowl-O-Rama in Welland.

Fort Erie has laid down a municipal challenge of exceeding their pledges of \$4,000 last year and the Killer Council team hopes to raise \$5,000.

The more funds raised, the more time and resources become available towards the matching process.

The Policy and Priorities committee reviewed the annual drinking water inspection results, facility allocation policy, vacation policy update, and the 2018 user fees and charges.

The user fees and charges are established to ensure that services specific to individuals are not subsidized by all ratepayers within the Town of Pelham.

Once approved by Council, the fee schedule will be made available, and includes the full list of user fees for the Town in 2018, encapsulating all fees charged by the clerk’s department, corporate services, fire & bylaw services, planning and development services, recreation, culture, and wellness services, and public works services.
